



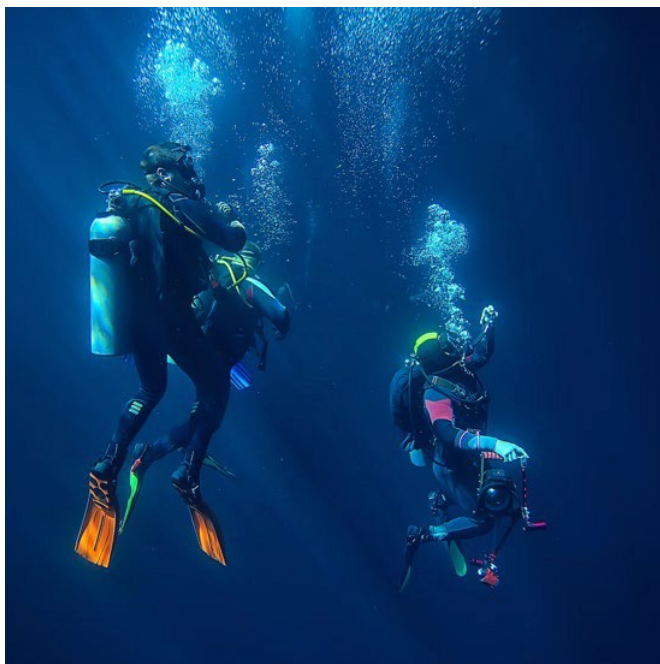
Certificate IV in Outdoor Leadership

Course Overview

The **Certificate IV in Outdoor Leadership (SIS40621 116421D)** is designed for individuals seeking advanced skills in leading outdoor adventure activities, with a specialization in **diving**. This course builds on foundational outdoor leadership principles, focusing on **technical diving skills, risk management, emergency response, and environmental sustainability**. Students will develop expertise in **leading dive expeditions, instructing participants, and managing outdoor adventure operations**, ensuring safe and responsible diving practices.

Graduates can pursue careers as **dive instructors, outdoor adventure guides, marine conservation specialists, or emergency response divers**, with pathways into **advanced dive certifications, tourism management, or environmental research**. This qualification provides leadership training for professionals aiming to supervise and coordinate outdoor recreation programs at a higher level.

Entry Requirements

- Students must be aged 18 years or over at the time of applying for admission to Austral College of Technology;
- Satisfactory completion of studies in applicant's home country equivalent to an Australian Year 12 qualification is required for entry into all qualifications; or
- Mature age students will be considered without the minimum education requirements but with relevant work experience within chosen area of study and a demonstrated capacity to meet course requirements; and
- Using pre-course English language assessment for Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing competencies within the Framework an assessment is made to determine applicant's appropriate course placement as per their level of proficiency in the English language;
- International students must hold a current and valid passport, a valid study visa that covers the duration of study for the course;
- International students will need to demonstrate English proficiency from one of the following:
 - a) IELTS band score of overall 6 (Academic or General) or equivalent in line with the Department of Education and department of Home Affairs (DHA) Regulations (For International Students) for specific countries; or
 - b) IELTS overall band score of 5.5 when packaged with at least 10 weeks' English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS); or
 - c) IELTS overall band score of 5 when packaged with at least 20 weeks' ELICOS; or
 - d) Pearson Test of English Academic – Score: Listening: 47, Reading: 48, Writing: 51, Speaking: 54; or
 - e) Cambridge English: Advanced CAE from Cambridge ESOL Test Scores; or
 - f) TOEFL Test of English as a Foreign Language paper-based test; or
 - g) CELS (all skills) Upper intermediate (English for Academic purposes) certificate from recognised English language centre; or
 - h) Senior secondary Certificate of Education completed in Australia; or
 - i) Certificate IV or higher completed in Australia; or
 - j) Tertiary studies in medium of English.
